ORDINANCE NO. 02023-61

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WILDWOOD, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR THE VOLUNTARY ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY CONSISTING OF APPROXIMATELY 3 ACRES MOL LOCATED ALONG CR 144, APPROXIMATELY 0.14 MILES EAST OF THE INTERSECTION OF CR 144 AND POWELL ROAD, IN SECTION 4, TOWNSHIP 19 SOUTH, RANGE 23 EAST: WHICH IS CONTIGUOUS TO THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF WILDWOOD AND LOCATED IN THE CITY'S JOINT PLANNING AREA: PROVIDING THAT SECTION 1-14 OF THE CITY OF WILDWOOD CODE OF ORDINANCES IS AMENDED TO INCLUDE THE ANNEXED PROPERTY: PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION: PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT: PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY: AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the City Commission of the City of Wildwood, Florida, as follows:

SECTION 1. Based upon the petition of the owner of the following described real property, which is located along CR 144, approximately 0.14 miles east of the intersection of CR 144 and Powell Road, to be annexed into the City, the property is hereby annexed into the City of Wildwood pursuant to Sections 171.044 and 171.204, Florida Statutes. The City Commission finds that the property is contiguous to the City of Wildwood; is located within the City's Joint Planning Area with Sumter County; and meets all legal requirements for annexation. The annexed property lying in Sumter County, Florida, owned by Southwinds Commercial LTD, is more particularly described as follows:

Parcel G04-013 Southwinds Commercial LTD (OWNER) 3 Acres +/-

LEGAL DESCRIPTION

PARCEL G04-013:

The land referred to herein below is situated in the County of Sumter, State of Florida, and described as follows:

The West 198 feet of the SE ¼ of the SW ¼ of the SW ¼ of Section 4, Township 19 South, Range 23 East, Sumter County, Florida, less Rights-of-Way.

- **SECTION 2.** All of the above-described annexed property shall be liable for its proportionate share of the future and existing indebtedness of the City of Wildwood.
- **SECTION 3.** All of the above-described annexed property shall be subject to the laws and ordinance of the City of Wildwood as if this territory had been a part of the City of Wildwood at the time of passage and approval of said laws and ordinances.
- **SECTION 4.** Until such time as the City amends its comprehensive plan, the current Sumter County zoning classification and future land use regulations will remain in full force and effect.
- **SECTION 5**. Section 1-14 of the City of Wildwood Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to include the legal description of the annexed parcel pursuant to this Ordinance. The location map identifying the property to be annexed is attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein by reference.
- **SECTION 6.** If any portion of this Ordinance is declared invalid for any purpose, the remaining portion shall remain valid and in full force and effect.
- **SECTION 7.** This Ordinance shall take effect upon final approval by the City Commission.
